A Warm Welcome To All Our Parishioners and Visitors Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Sunday 12th October 2025



Dear Parishioners,

The Old Testament shows how Abraham, our Father in faith, obeyed the command of the Lord and established the Hebrew People. The Children of Israel were the Chosen People of the Lord, and God gave them a land to live and freely worship Him. That is part of the reason why Naaman, the Syrian, asks for two heaps of earth in order to sacrifice to the Lord: Naaman wants to ensure that he is worshiping the God of Israel, even if he is not a Hebrew himself.

The Gospel today shows how Christ began to teach his disciples that he came not only for the Hebrews, but all people. It is very significant that the only Leaper to return and give thanks was not a Jew, but a foreigner. With Christ's Death and Resurrection, the Old Law of Moses was replaced with the New Law of the Gospel. St Peter's letters and the Letter to the Hebrews reminds us that the members of the Church are the people of the New Covenant in Christ. One of the early hymns of the Church, still used in Sundays for Morning Prayer, refers to Christians as the 'true Israelites'. Christianity is not a religion for the few, but for many. Christ did not come to redeem a small portion of humanity, but all people throughout the world. As Christ tells the Samaritan woman to the well, 'salvation is from the Jews'; but not for the Jews alone.

That includes us. We are the foreigners from various backgrounds and histories. We have had our own encounters with Christ that remind us that we are loved by Him, no matter what our story is. We need to be more like the thankful leaper in today's Gospel. For everything that God has given and continues to give us, we must have a heart that is thankful and ready to express our gratitude before anything else.

THE SACRAMENTS OF FIRST HOLY COMMUNION AND RECONCILIATION

To register your child for our First Holy Communion preparation classes, the following requirements must be met: • The child must have already been baptised in the Catholic faith. • We will accept children of parents who are registered with and are practicing members of St Ann's Parish.
