Dedication of the Lateran Basilica

Sunday 9th November 2025



Dear Parishioners.

Today's feast is a reminder of the universality of the Catholic Church and our union with the Bishop of Rome. We celebrate the dedication of the Major Papal, Patriarchal, and Roman Archbasilica, Metropolitan and Primatial Cathedral of the Most Holy Saviour and Saints John the Baptist and Evangelist in the Lateran, Mother and Head of all the Churches in Rome and the World (simply known as the Basilica of St John Lateran).

This is the Pope's cathedral church, and therefore the most important church in the City of Rome. Given to Pope St Sylvester I by the Emperor Constantine, the church was once attached to the Lateran Palace, one of the imperial residences in Rome. Since the early fourth century the Pope's used this church, just within the ancient city walls, as their home and office. The Diocese of Rome still maintains its Curial offices near the Basilica. While the Vatican basilica and palace have always been important due to the presence of St Peter's relics, it only became the main residence of the Pope's in the nineteenth century. The Pope's cathedral remains important because it is the focus of unity throughout the world, and it is from the cathedra (bishop's chair) that the Pope teaches us about the Catholic Faith.

The feasts of dedications of churches are considered feasts of Our Lord. The Church building represents the community that gathers there to pray, and the Lord is truly present in every church due to His presence in the Blessed Sacrament residing in the tabernacle (This is my body...), the community of believers who gather together in prayer (where two or three are gathered in my name...), and the Scriptures that are proclaimed (In the beginning was the Word...). The building is also a literal concrete expression of the faith of the people who built it and worship there.

As we celebrate today's feast, we celebrate our Catholic faith, a faith not confined to one part of the world or one particular people, but a faith that belongs to the whole world. We pray for the unity of Christians everywhere, that we all might stand together in praise of God and against the evils of the world. And we pray for the Pope and the bishops united with him, that they may faithfully continue to preach the Gospel of Jesus Christ to their cities and the entire world.




THE CHOSEN SEASON 5

BAPTISM

New and expectant parents are invited to contact the parish office to begin baptism preparation. Regular Sunday Mass attendance and a one-hour class are required before scheduling. The class can be taken before your child is born. Baptisms ordinarily take place after 10.00 am Sunday Mass.

Children aged 7 and up will need age-appropriate Catholic instruction before baptism. Please introduce yourself to Fr Ian after Mass for more details.

THE SACRAMENTS OF FIRST HOLY COMMUNION AND RECONCILIATION

To register your child for our First Holy Communion preparation classes, the following requirements must be met: The child must have already been baptised in the Catholic faith. •We will accept children of parents who are registered with and are practicing members of St Ann's Parish.
