### Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Sunday 1<sup>st</sup> February 2026

Dear Parishioners,

St Paul is still trying to put right the wrongs in Corinth that he has heard about from Chloe's people. Of course, all the Corinthians were relatively recent converts to the faith, and he is reminding them of their own journeys to understanding and accepting the Gospel. It was obviously not a very straightforward decision for any of them, and even St Paul had his own ups and downs in accepting the Gospel.

No matter how old we were when we were baptised, every day is a new opportunity to turn towards Christ and accept the Gospel. There are many days that this seems easy, and many others where it is difficult. St Paul is reminding the Corinthians and us that we need to recall our own difficulties in living and accepting our faith in Jesus Christ before we start to judge and look down on others. So many experiences, feelings, emotions, and thoughts come our way that help or hinder our faith journey. There are moments why we can question God's wisdom, which is far different from our own. There are moments when we can get frustrated or downright angry about things that have happened to us or others.

While we might have remained true to our faith in the end, we all know that it is not always easy. Therefore, we are called to assist and help our brothers and sisters in the faith when they have their own struggles. We are called to support them as best we can and have that patience with them that understands that having faith and living out our faith can often be a struggle. Even Christ prayed in the Garden of Gethsemane to be spared the crucifixion, and on the Cross he prayed by using Psalm 21 (22): My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?

This week, we should pray for the grace to have the patience to stand with those struggling in their faith, especially for those who no longer practice, so that our example of true love and concern can assist them to come back to Christ and His Church.

## DEATH ANNIVERSARIES IN THE PARISH NEWSLETTER

Over the years, many parishioners have asked about the inclusion of loved ones in the weekly death anniversary notices printed in the newsletter. We would like to take this opportunity to explain how this began and how it will work going forward.

The death anniversary announcements were first introduced in 2018 during Fr John's time here, following his first funeral celebrated in the parish. At that time, the list included only those whose funerals had taken place at St Ann's, and it continued in this way for subsequent years.

Since then, many parishioners have asked whether loved ones who died before 2018 could be included, and of course this is possible. I have always encourage anyone who asks to share this information with others who may also wish to have a name included.

The November Remembrance Book could be a source for this however, this does not cover everyone, as that book only dates back to 2001.

To make this more inclusive and clearer for everyone, we will now be changing how this is done. A list will be placed for the few months or so, in the church porch where parishioners can add the name and date of death of their deceased loved ones. Once compiled, these names will be included in the newsletter in the appropriate month for that deceased's anniversary.

This will of course take time, so I ask for your patience.

**PLEASE ONLY USE THE LIST, DO NOT  
EMAIL THESE INTO THE OFFICE.**

The deceased does **not** need to have had their funeral at St Ann's, but they should have a clear and meaningful connection to the parish, ideally past parishioners or immediate family members of current parishioners.
